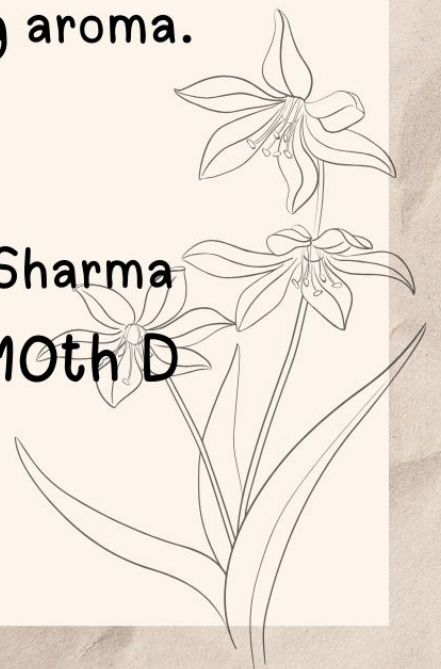
Silent Love

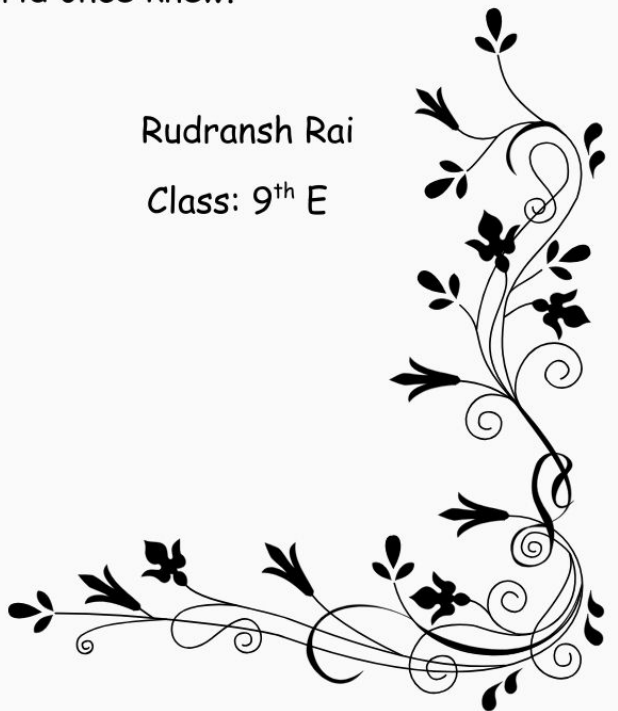

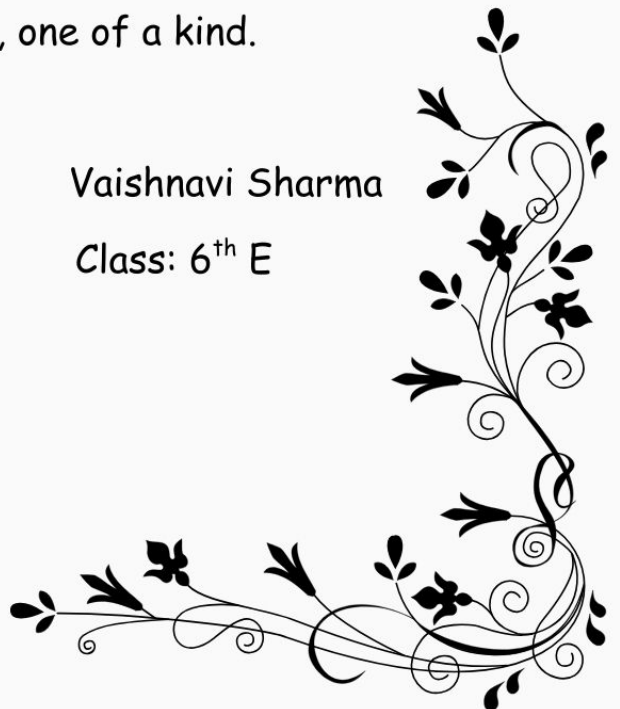




Grandparents, a treasure

The Day Bob Discovered Peace

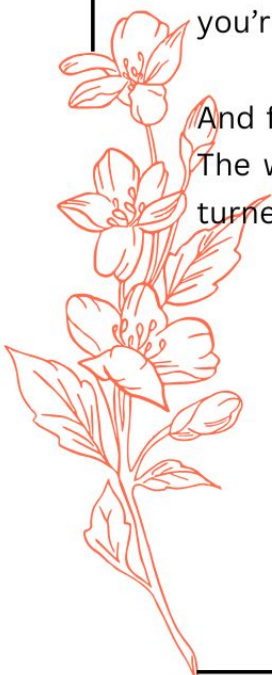
